



#### **Early Missionary Letters**

Nisbet to his sister in Glasgow, rated "3" and "8", showing on face "PAID SHIP LETTER/Crown/SYDNEY" oval d.s. and on reverse London and Glasgow d.s. The long and interesting contents, basically a resumé of "how we have got on thus far", include a reference to "3 vessels in the harbour wh have been at various islands in search of sandalwood", his comments on the building of his house, the native being friendly, native chiefs being given presents, "The volcano sometimes makes a great noise and sends out clouds of sparks" and the setting up of classes for boys and girls. A fascinating insight into early missionary life in the South Seas. The earliest recorded cover from the New Hebrides. Photo
