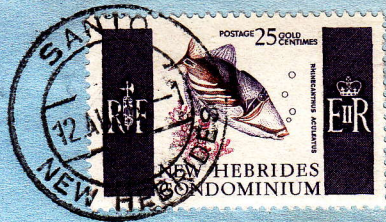

Adaptation of Australian 9c (A-25) with the flying kangaroo motif and the unframed, indicium including jet tail, 'AUSTRALIA' and '9c' denomination, all removed. Length of address lines, front panel, 89mm (cf. SA-5, 66mm).

First day unknown, mid(?) - 1966. Earliest usage sighted, 25 July 1966, Port Vila, New Hebrides. (<http://www.ro-klinger.de/NH/>) Decimal definitive 9c Australian aerogramme issued 14 February 1966.

Known used from New Hebrides and Norfolk Island. A flown example from Papua New Guinea seen. Properly used examples are scarce/rare.

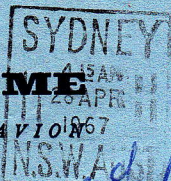
New Hebrides usage: Commercially used from Edouard Wagner from 'Mission St Therese, SANTO' to Illinois, USA. Br. definitives attached, 5cg Lake/brown/blue, *Loading Manganese*, *Forari Wharf* and 25cg, Violet/brown, *Rhinecanthus aculeatus*, total 30cg. Tied by double-circle cancellation: SANTO, NEW HEBRIDES, 12AUG.67-1.

Non Port Vila usage scarce.

Plate variety, spot before AVION.

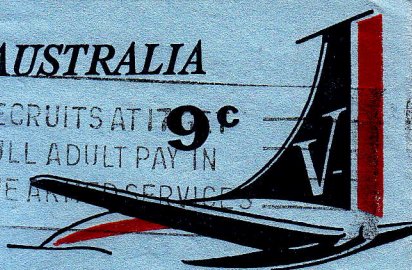
